Introduction

Conduct – Junior Officers

Conduct – Senior/Staff Officers

- 1. At all times, be courteous and respectful to other members;
- 2. Complete all training requirements in the allocated time frame,
- 3. Comply with all Instructions, Policies and Regulations;
- 4. Comply with all directions given by a senior member in your chain of command,
- 5. Never share information or resources with people, who are not members of AAV;
- 6. Discharge your duties in accordance with Management Standing Orders,
- 7. Be a role model to our subordinates.
